École Campbelltown Quick Facts:

- For the 2017-2018 school year, École Campbelltown has a student population of approximately 541 students.
- École Campbelltown students are served by 38 certificated and classified staff.
- École Campbelltown was the first school to open in Sherwood Park.
- The total school budget: \$3,292,509 which includes 94% of total budget dedicated to staffing.

Programming highlights:

- École Campbelltown is a single track French Immersion program
- École Campbelltown offers a French Fine Arts program
- Character education and global citizenship are two focal points at École Campbelltown.
- Technology includes video streaming, laptops, iPads, Chromebooks and online media.
- Learning assistance is offered in French
- Extra-Curricular activities include: Lego Robotics, Leadership Opportunities, Intramurals, Track Club, CBN TV team, Recycling Club, Choir, Handbells, Tech Club, Gardening Club and AMA safety patrollers.

What were the greatest challenges faced in 2016-2017?

- Continued to have new staff members, including several first year teachers, join the École Campbelltown team.
- The recruitment of quality French Immersion teachers and support staff
- The promotion of the program within Elk Island Public Schools and the community
- Quality French resources and appropriate support and professional development for our staff
- Continued teacher involvement in offering and increasing the participation of students in leadership roles.

How, and to what degree, did those challenges impact planning for 2017-2018?

- Staffing took place early in 2017 so that we were able to find quality staff
- Continuation of a Career and Technology Foundation program for grade 5 and 6 students in order to increase student and teacher engagement and leadership in areas of passion.

Successes in 2016 - 2017

- Increase in number and age range of students participating in leadership opportunities in the school and community
- School council was involved in leadership opportunities in the community (Farm to Table, Mental Health Day, Christmas Bureau and Road Side Clean Up)
- First Nations, Métis and Inuit art option was introduced with the grade 5 & 6 students
- Literacy was supported through a cross graded reading program where older students were meeting regularly with younger students to support their literacy.
- The French Immersion program continues to grow at École Campbelltown.

- There was a focus on numeracy and manipulative use in division 2 classes. Each class now has access to various teaching tools for numeracy.
- Great collaboration between the French Immersion schools both within EIPS and other school districts
- A very successful Fine Arts program was held in three rotations at Gallery 501 based on Jason Carter's work, dance with Girandole, and a community art paper project which was displayed at Gallery 501.
- Provincial Achievement Test results were maintained and improved.
- Accountability Pillar results were maintained or improved.
