5. Teacher Presentation - Pauline Proulx

- Pauline discusses the implications of full-day kindergarten programming and how students in the program currently are adapting and handling the full-day format. She shares her general observations:
 - Students seems to be adapting more readily to the full-day schedule when they reach grade one.
 - There is no apparent delay in language learning from the full-day breaks in between school days.
 - Students still enjoy the full-day of academic learning as per curriculum, and the full-day format seems to allow teachers to stay on track with learning objectives when schedules are affected by school events.
 - Generally, children are not having difficulty with attentiveness for the full-day of class.
 - Parents who would like to observe a class are encouraged to schedule a time to visit!

- Christmas concerts were a huge success! Many parents enjoyed the evening concerts at Park Church and the kindergarden concert during the day at the school.
- There are 75 students registered to Kindergarten so far.
